Who is eligible to play, and what are the requirements?

All children between the ages of 6 and 18 are welcome to play, regardless of their ability. If a parent feels their son or daughter would like to bowl, they are eligible. Simple as that. From typical kids to those with any disability; from Autism and Cerebral Palsy to Down syndrome, all who would enjoy bowling qualify to join our **USP Bowling program!**

What is the Unified Sports Program?

Our programs allows all athletes to learn and enjoy a wide variety of sports and social events. These programs foster social skills to all that participate. Many children with disabilities have wanted to go out and play sports just like their family and friends. USP offers that opportunity. Our area's more typical youth are encouraged to join in and learn a very simple lesson that everyone is different and can enjoy sports together regardless of their skill level.

The **Unified Sports Program (USP)** moves on to **Bowling** in February. The program is being held at the AMF Bowling Lanes in Chicopee. Sign-ups for Bowling can be done online or at other **USP** events. We will bowl for 1 hour each week.

There is a \$10 signup fee for all participants. Family and friends are welcome to join in at the same cost. Shoe rental and 6 weeks of bowling included. If money is a concern, USP will cover the cost, please let us know!

There is a limit of 75 participants, including family members, so please sign up as soon as possible. All bowlers must be registered before the first week as we are paying our costs upfront and need an accurate number.
